AGAIN, EL-ZAKZAKY'S SUPPORTERS PROTEST IN ABUJA - DAILY SUN PG.40

Following the continuous detention of Sheikh El-Zakzaky, his supporters under the auspices of Islamic Movement of Nigeria (IMN), yesterday, in Abuja, staged another protest, demanding the release of their leader. The protest disrupted vehicular and business activities, as the group. Which walked from Maitama District down to Wuse and Area 1, insisted their leader had not done anything to warrant his continuous detention. A release signed by Abdullahi Muhammad, on behalf of the Academic Forum of the Islamic Movement in Nigeria, accused President Muhammadu Buhari and the National Security Adviser (NSA) of trying to kill El-Zakzaky.

President Muhammadu Buhari has expressed worry over the huge sums of foreign currencies, which he claims, are being circulated in the country ahead of Saturday's presidential and National Assembly elections. A State House statement on Thursday said the President expressed his worries during Wednesday's Federal Executive Council meeting in Abuja. The statement, which was signed by the presidential spokesman, Mr Garba Shehu, said Buhari "accused some politicians of

flouting money laundering regulations in their desperate bid to capture political power.”

FG, AGF ASK SUPREME COURT TO STRIKE OUT CROSS RIVER'S SUIT ON ONNOGHEN - PUNCH PG. 42, NATION PG.41

The Federal Government and the Attorney General of the Federation, Mr Abubakar Malami, have asked the Supreme Court to strike out a suit by the Cross River Government challenging the trial of the Chief Justice of Nigeria, Justice Walter Onnoghen, before the Code of Conduct Tribunal, and his suspension by President Muhammadu Buhari. They ask the court to decline jurisdiction to hear the suit, as the issues complained of by the plaintiff in it were personal to Onnoghen.
