BUHARI SAYS HIS GOVT'S DUTY IS TO JAIL LOOTERS - PUNCH PG. 2

President Muhammadu Buhari, on Saturday, maintained that the duty of his administration was to imprison those who had looted the nation's treasury. He said it was his government's responsibility to send to jail those who had corruptly enriched themselves by dipping their hands into the country's commonwealth.

The President said this in Lagos at the presidential rally of the All Progressives Congress, where he promised that if re-elected, he would continue to focus on the promises he made in 2015.

A former Chairman of the liquidated Skye Bank, Mr. Tunde Ayeni, is back in the custody of the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) for allegedly diverting and spending about N29.5 billion depositors' cash without justification. Ayeni is alleged to have disbursed about N3 billion of the sum to a former governor of Bayelsa State, the late Chief Diepreye Alamieyeseigha for "protecting the bank from attacks by militants."
