A' COURT DISMISSES ONNOGHEN'S APPEALS, FAULTS CCT'S SUSPENSION ORDER - PUNCH PG.13, SUN PG.45, NATION PG.2, DAILYTRUST PG.6, THISDAY PG.8

The Abuja Division of the Court of Appeal on Friday threw out four appeals filed by former Chief Justice of Nigeria, Justice Walter Onnoghen, regarding his trial by the Code of Conduct Tribunal. But the court in its one of the four unanimous judgements of the three-man panel, faulted the ex parte order issued by the CCT on January 23, 2019 for Onnoghen's suspension.

IGBO DAY: S'EAST GOVS OHANAEZE, ALAIGBO GROUP ARE SABOTEURS - IPOB - SUN PG.10, NATION PG.6

The Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) on Friday abruptly stopped evidence by its 13th witness in the fraud trials of former Gov. Ayo Fayose, saying that it appeared the witness was trying to be hostile. The witness, Mr Adewale Aladegbola, who introduced himself as a former driver of a bullion van in Zenith bank, had testified that he did not have operation on April 16, 2015.

The Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) will re-arraign former Minister of the Federal Capital Territory, Mrs Jumoke Akinjide, for alleged money laundering on June 11. The anti-graft agency charged her along with People's Democratic Party (PDP) leader in Oyo State, Chief Olarenwaju Otit, and former Senator representing Oyo Central Senatorial District, Ayo Adeseun.

The Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) yesterday said it arrested and quizzed two fast-rising musicians - Afeez Fashola (aka Naira Marley), Omoniyi Temidayo Rapheal (aka Zlatan) and three others over alleged Internet Fraud. It said the suspects volunteered useful information.

After series of setbacks, the trial of the Managing Director of First Naton Airlines Mr. Kayode Odukoya finally began yesterday, withy the first prosecution witness, Patrick Ogu, a banker, telling the court how Odukoya misrepresented the fact that made Skye Bank now Polaris Bank released loan facilities to the defendants with forged documents. The Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) had arraigned Odukoya before Justice Mojisola Dada of the Special Offences Court sitting in Ikeja on four counts bordering on forgery, use of false

information perjury and stealing to the tune of ₦1,741,994,962.04 on March 16, 2018.
